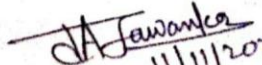

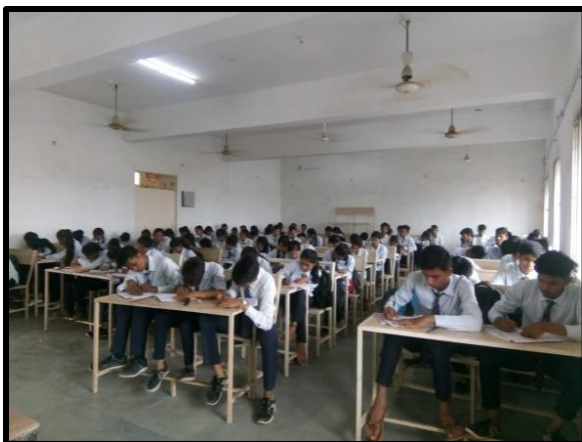


7. Essay Competition on “Gender Equality”
